Task 1: We've looked at a little of the main theories of CLIL. But what does it mean for teachers? Complete the text below with the correct words from the box.

What do CLIL teachers do?

CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning) subject teachers aim to teach content and some language. It's necessary for them to work with both subject and language teachers. They give <sup>1</sup> feedback to help students on content and sometimes on language.

CLIL teachers are required to <sup>2</sup> develop some new <sup>3</sup> skills and have a clear understanding of the language used in their subject. It is also the responsibility of the CLIL teacher to try to raise students' <sup>4</sup> awareness of how language is used in the subject. This can help students <sup>5</sup> overcome difficulties associated with the language of the subject/content lesson. <sup>6</sup> Activating learners' existing knowledge about the topics they are learning can aid understanding and processing of new information. In addition, CLIL teachers need to encourage <sup>7</sup> interaction between students through activities which practise speaking and writing.

There are a number of challenges facing CLIL teachers including deciding on input, finding and adopting materials and <sup>8</sup> guiding understanding. That's why it's important for teachers new to CLIL to be realistic and patient in their undertakings in CLIL.
